ADVOCACY

Summary of accomplishment from 2023

- SORCA completed a 6 month Economic Impact & Resident Sentiment research study project surveying over 1000 riders
- Signed a 10 year Partnership Agreement renewal with RSTBC
- Signed a 10 year Volunteer Partnership Agreement with BC Parks (including trails in Alice Lake and Garibaldi Lake) provincial parks
- Received approval for Stone Ridge the first trail approved under our MOU with the Squamish Nation
- Postponement of harvesting block that would have negatively affected Alpine Capone
- Secured funding for the Lower Diamondhead/ Pseudo trailhead improvements
- Front Country (Trails Inventory (FCTI) completion of steps 3 of 4 (Q1 2024 report completion)
